Summary description of the key features of the tool (developed and/or implemented)

Output O.T3.1 was developed within the thematic work package 3, titled “*Revitalisation concepts and pilot actions*”, as a part of Activity A.T3.1 - “*Revitalisation concept and pilot implementation*”, started in July 2018 and successfully completed at the beginning of October 2018. It is designed to be the basis for implementation phase of revitalization process of historical park and takes into account already gained knowledge, obtained through the course of the project.

The historical area, that we’re focused on. Is the Historical Park of the Museum-Castle in Łańcut. The earliest information concerning the garden by the Castle dates back to the end of the 18th century, when Stanisław Lubomirski, the great crown marshal, and his wife Izabela Lubomirska of the Czartoryski family were conducting works over the rebuilding of the fortress in Łańcut. Converting it into palace-park complex resulted in considerable changes in its surrounding. Partly levelled soil banks were integrated into the composition of the newly existing garden. Our Revitalization Concept is based for the Italian Garden. In our Revitalization Concept, we plan, among others: to change the surface of the paths; recreate the system of bowling greens; set the flowerbed and edging system; keep the lawns and seasonal plants in a proper condition; make the complex maintenance of fountains, paying attention to the body of water inserted in the ground; make the conservation of the sculpture “Bacchus”, occupying the central point in Italian Garden; and increase history consciousness and accessibility for everyone, install at least five signposts and two information boards. Thanks to revitalization works, the accessibility for disabled people will also increase. The notice boards will let the blind and the visually impaired get acquainted with the fundamental assumptions and characteristic elements of the garden interior. Also, thanks to revitalization activities that took place in the past and will take place in the near future, the park will be adapted to the needs of people with physical disabilities. 5 signposts will be located in public places, helping to find the orientation and moving around the facility for everyone. In connection with revitalization activities, the Park in Łańcut, apart from revitalization activities in the material context will also prepare educational tools: Questing, dicatic paths, mobile tool and storytelling.

Expected impact and benefits of the tool for the concerned territories and target groups

Immediate impact of this output is the cooperation between different target groups which has been established while developing the document.

Thanks to revitalization works, the historical and plants system will not only be restored but through new surfaces, the accessibility for the disabled will increase.

The notice boards will let the blind and the visually impaired get acquainted with the fundamental assumptions and characteristic elements of the garden interior.

Additionally the enterprise will gain educational and scientific value- by increasing the awareness of creating historical gardens and parks through the ages.

The society will get to know the elements of designing characteristic for the beginning of the 20th century. It is worth to remember that garden art is a part of historical awareness. Combining Italian garden with the architecture (Castle) will constitute the complete work of art and become the part of cultural and natural heritage.

Sustainability of the tool and its transferability to other territories and stakeholders

Sustainability, especially cultural sustainability will be reached in the next phases of thematic work package 3. Revitalisation concept is the basis for the development of detailed technical plans and the development of Local action plan, which will ensure the implementation of revitalization process and final goal of revitalised historical park Lancut, open for public use and accessible to all. Successfully completed revitalization process will have an immediate impact on public citizens as well as local and regional public authority.

Evaluation of the tool will provide us with data, which will be presented in Transnational Strategy which will be transferred transnationally. Transferability will also be ensured through already established partners network to transfer the outputs to other regions and cities in Central Europe.

Thanks to revitalization works, the historical and plants system will not only be restored but through new surfaces, the accessibility for the disabled will increase.

Lessons learned from the development/implementation process of the tool and added value of transnational cooperation

Output presents a revitalisation concept which is different in terms of design and complexity in comparison to other revitalization concepts, created by our partners. Each historical park has its own characteristics, level of development, ownership structure, tools already applied etc. and needs to be considered individually. Transnational cooperation is therefore extremely important, especially dissemination of know-how of already established good practices and management/maintenance regimes.

A very important learning of good practices from transnational partners. Other countries have developed some solutions earlier and are a model for further actions.

Activities within the HICAPS project will give the opportunity to leave the cultural heritage to future generations, to be part of the international context of civilization legacy.

There will be an increase at the local, national and international level, awareness of the importance of intangible cultural heritage and ensuring that this heritage is mutually appreciated.
